

Mitchell Hall and 10 Force Support Squadron strives to deliver innovative and desirable cadet food service programs such as the Cadet Campus Dining System (CCDS or “Ceediss”). Currently cadets are limited to food options within Mitchell Hall, this system allows more variety and dining options on USAFA. Over 4300 USAFA cadets will be able to use their food dollars outside Mitchell Hall at 10 FSS Food & Beverage (F&B) operations on USAFA beginning next month. CCDS is limited to FSS, these Non-appropriated Fund (NAF) F&B operations will offer cadets the ability to use their Common Access Card (CAC) as a method of payment at FSS Point of Sale (POS) systems to purchase food and beverages. Once implemented, cadets will be able to utilize this expanded benefit using a portion of their daily subsistence entitlement at participating NAF activities similar to a college or university campus.

Phase I of CCDS is available at the following 10 FSS Food & Beverage operations:

- Polaris Perk
- Academy Lanes Grill (Bowling)
- Haps

The phase I participating NAF operation will initially offer limited menus and will eventually expand to offer more items. Excluded items include alcohol, energy drinks & specialty coffees.

Phase II will expand to include limited on-line ordering and fulfillment for dinner meals to locations in Arnold & Mitchell Halls

Cadet Campus Dining System (CCDS) Day Parts in NAF Food & Beverage operations are as follows:

07:00 AM – 09:59	BREAKFAST	up to \$ 13.80 each day
10:00 AM – 14:59	LUNCH	up to \$ 15.55 each day
15:00 PM – 2030	DINNER	up to \$ 18.80 each day

Cadets are reminded that their entitlement is for their own personal consumption, not to be used for other than the authorized member presenting their CAC entitlement. AFSVC manages the system through automating reporting from activity to activity and uses this data to budget, audit and manage the program. Note that CCDS differs from the Air Force *legacy* Campus Dining System (CDS) for active duty airmen on EMS. CCDS and CDS are funded from different sources and are not interchangeable. Cadet candidates at the prep school and active duty airmen are not eligible for CCDS on USAFA.
