





HOW TO SUCCESSFULLY APPLY FOR TUITION ASSISTANCE

The Education Office has recently seen an uptick in issues and problems service members are experiencing using Tuition Assistance. Often these problems are due to not adhering to the *rules of engagement* for using TA. The costs can be steep, from not having your TA funding request approved up to having to pay out of pocket. Missing out on "free money" because of avoidable errors would be unfortunate.

The privilege of using TA comes with the expectation that service members will follow the guidelines, as found in AFI 36-2670. The process in AFVEC is very prescribed; no item of necessary information can be guessed or approximated. The Education Office has seen many cases recently of service members guessing course dates or cost per credit hour, requesting TA for courses they're not enrolled in, taking classes not on their degree plans, and other issues.

The following information is required for every TA request you make in AFVEC:

1. The exact dates of your course (if



these dates are incorrect, your school will not invoice the Air Force IAW the DoD MOU they signed) and you could end up paying for your courses out of pocket.

- 2. Course number and name (for example, PSY 100: Introduction to Psychology)
- 3. Academic Level (from drop-down menu)
- 4. Location (online, resident, etc. from drop-down)
- 5. Number of credits
- 6. Credit type (know if your school uses semester hours or quarter hours)
- Cost per credit hour (the exact amount your school charges - it's also your responsibility to know if your school requires validation of your active-duty status to receive a reduced tuition rate)
- 8. Help us help you! Please make sure your information is absolutely correct when you apply. The AFVEC system is such that some mistakes can't be corrected, causing your TA request to be rejected and/or deleted. If you conscientiously complete all TA funding requests, we are more than happy to approve them!






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
